





- I think more group activity and switching partners every time would be an improvement.
- being a full-year course, so you could make a series of podcasts (like a season)
- A more flexible grading scale that acknowledges the differences among even a group of beginners.
  - More time for group projects and group discussions during class time
- Other guest speakers from the community
- Make the group assignment a \*tiny\* bit longer! Two days was too short. And, try to get the class to sit in a circle, even if the enrollment increases. It makes discussion better!
